Local Action for Global Goals 2023



This event showcased Sunway's commitment to inclusivity. Over 50 charities, NGOs, and global brands participated, along with Malaysia's First Sustainable Ambulance. The event also featured pre-loved items, a Book Sharing booth, and a Wishing Wall, fulfilling wishes for 280 children from local orphanages and refugee homes, adding a unique positive dimension to the week's activities.

Trident Games 2023



Trident Games is a biennial sports carnival launched by Sunway Education Group (SEG) Prof. Dato' Dr Elizabeth Lee on March 15, 2023. Last year, the event, which promotes unity among Bandar Sunway communities, welcomed participation from Sunway University, Monash University, Taylor's University, Asia Pacific University, and International Medical University, boasting a total of 439 athletes (390 students and 49 staff) in 14 sporting events.

Sunway University Partners with Euroasia Association and Trinity College London



Sunway University has signed Memorandum of Understandings (MoUs) with Euroasia Association of Performing Arts and Trinity College London. Euroasia aims to develop the classical music scene in Malaysia, enabling talented young musicians to participate in jointly hosted competitions, while Trinity College London is a leading provider of external music examinations. The collaboration means Sunway students will gain a more comprehensive study of music pedagogy.

Community in Action (CIA)

Sunway University announced the launch of its "Community In Action" campaign to promote crime prevention and awareness among students and the broader community. 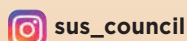

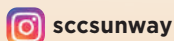

Sunway College Student Council

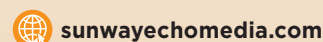

Come and join SCC to engage with your college community on a deeper level, and work together to create a positive and inclusive environment for all.



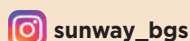

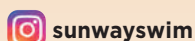

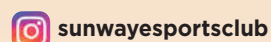

Sunway University Ranks #1 Private University in ASEAN



Sunway University has been ranked the #1 Private University in ASEAN by AppliedHE Private University Ranking ASEAN 2024.

The AppliedHE Public and Private University Ranking ASEAN saw participation from numerous public and private institutions from all across the ASEAN region. This regional ranking system measures key elements which are fundamental to the performance of an education institution as well as aspects most important to students and parents when deciding on their higher education journey. These parameters include the quality of teaching and learning, employability, research and community engagement, all of which Sunway University has excelled consistently in over the years.

In addition to this accolade, Sunway University dominates the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2024 as Malaysia's number one non-government-linked private university. The university improved its league table position by one band, moving from 801-1000 last year to 601-800. Its strong performance extends to subject categories such as Business & Management (#301-400) and Physical Sciences (#601-800).

The University is also ranked by Talentbank as the number one in Graduate Employability among all universities in Malaysia for two consecutive years. The one-of-a-kind educational and interactive week was then wrapped up in the most special way; a colourful parade of our students dolled up in their favourite costumes.

Young Malaysian Poets SNaPS™ Up Grand Prizes with Big Voices

Do not underestimate our young friends as time and time again, they have proved to be huge talents packaged in tiny builds. These gifted poets snapped up grand prizes at the annual Sunway National Poetry Slam™ (SNaPS™) that was back for its 9th edition in 2023.

Supported by the Ministry of Education Malaysia (MoE), SNaPS™ aims to encourage spoken word performances among youths from both government and international schools in Malaysia. Spoken word can help students develop into more grounded, self-aware, and empathetic adults



by spurring their creativity, improving their communication, and discovering their voice.

Going by the theme of "Culture", the competition kicked off in July where students from a total of 35 schools across the country, including schools from the Klang Valley area, Ipoh, Kedah, Johor and Sarawak participated.

Dr. Nicholas Lee, Chief Judge and the Head of Centre English Language Studies (CELS) at Sunway University said that poetry can be seen as the essence of good writing as it requires a critical and observant mind to form concrete images and express abstract ideas through words.

Aiden Ting Fu Yu from Sunway City International School took home the title for the **Junior Category** as the first-place winner with Tee Ning Marn from HELP International School and Tan Hui Yin from SMK Bandar Utama Damansara (3) as the second and third place winners respectively with their equally captivating performances.

In the **Senior Category**, Muhammad Haikal Hariz Bin Mohd Azhan from SMK Taman Seri Rampai scored a triumphant win while Nithilaa Devi A/P Suresh Naidu from SMK Assunta liven up the atmosphere, earning her the second place and Wong Wen Fong from Inspiros International School achieving third place with a powerful and moving piece.

Securing the first place for the **Group Category** was the dynamic team The Bare Minimum from SMK Bandar Utama Damansara (3) with a high-spirited piece. HIS Wordsmiths from HELP International School fired up their game and came in second, while ISPoetry from International School @Parkcity's invigorating performance won them the third place.

The **Spirit Award** was presented to SK Taman Tun Dr. Ismail (1) for accumulating the most votes during the grand finals. Sunway City International School on the other hand, successfully bagged the **Helios Award** as the overall champion with the highest total combined scores.

Echo Buzz:

Musings with George Yeo

At the highly anticipated book launch event, 'From Thoughts to Pages: Launch of George Yeo: Musings,' Echo had the honour of interviewing the esteemed Former Foreign Affairs Minister of Singapore, George Yeo. The atmosphere was brimming with intellectual curiosity as we delved into a discussion that transcended the pages of his newly unveiled work. Now, allow us to present the exclusive conversation that encapsulates the essence of his profound insights and reflections.

Q: You have served in various ministries – Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Information, Communications and the Arts, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Trade and Industry and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. What strategies did you employ to promote Singapore as a hub for innovation, technology, and education on the global stage?

A: Well, it was about leveraging our strengths while being realistic about our capabilities. We positioned ourselves strategically, recognising the changing trends in information and technology, and focused on areas where we could excel. Knowing how our interests match global advancements helps us navigate and participate effectively in these developments.

Q: What were the most significant leadership challenges you faced during your leadership and how did you address them?

A: One of the major challenges was navigating the fine line between national interest and international relations. It needed a careful touch, involving detailed diplomacy to keep trust and balance without giving up our stance on crucial matters. We worked to align our priorities with global partnerships, making decisions that matched our nation's vision while building cooperative ties with other countries. It meant skillfully navigating through multifaceted geopolitical landscapes, sticking to our stand on key issues, and forming friendly alliances for shared progress and stability.

Q: As Minister of Information, Communications & Art, you liberalised the use of local dialects in Singaporean media. How do you feel about the declining use of dialects in younger generations?

A: Finding the right balance is tricky. We value our cultural heritage but also recognise the need to adapt to the present. Our approach has

been gradual, promoting cultural preservation while acknowledging the trend towards a more standardised language. Realism is key, showing interest in dialects, and allocating resources sensibly – it's a process. Everyone has their preferences, and it's like that with languages too. English is not a must-know, but its widespread use makes it beneficial. Similarly, speaking Tamil may not be easy, but we hope future generations will inherit it naturally over time.

Q: Can you share any personal experiences or anecdotes that highlight the dynamics of the Singapore-Malaysia relationship during your leadership?

A: There were tense moments, especially regarding territorial disputes. However, dialogue and diplomacy played crucial roles. The resolution of these issues often involved intricate negotiations and mutual respect. During a critical negotiation between Singapore and Malaysia, a significant issue came up regarding a railway line. There seemed to be a disagreement concerning the terms of the contract from Singapore's perspective. Despite Singapore insisting there wasn't an issue, a prolonged standoff persisted. I emphasised the need to clarify uncertainties and suggested finding a mutually beneficial solution—a win-win approach. Generosity and fair dealing were key values, seeking a resolution that provided benefits to both parties.

Q: There was a speech you made at the Danube Institute that highlighted the thought of "Family name first" – would you say that the family name [Yeo] comes before the individual for yourself?

A: Both are part of me, and I cannot choose. You may ask, why is it the father's name and not the mother's



name – but that's tradition. If you break the tradition, you stand the risk of being ostracised. For most of us, we may not believe everything in our culture, but we respect it nonetheless.

Q: Do you have any regrets in your career that you wish you could go back and undo now?

A: Others have asked me this question, and I have not had any difficulty thinking through it. When you make a decision, it is with the best information available to you. When you look back, you have new information. I would not have deliberately done something wrong. But you make mistakes. A mistake I made once was: I met an American Secretary of State. She had travelled a long distance, and I knew that. I said "Oh, you must be very tired," and she reacted on the supposition that she looked bad. I shouldn't have said that, and I learned my lesson. I should've said, "I know you've had a long flight, it's amazing how you keep up". It's the little things you learn when you make mistakes.

Q: Today we have witnessed the launch of your new book, *Musings*. What do you hope to achieve from these books, and is it about your personal legacy or guiding future leaders?

A: It's a mix of everything – it's almost like having a conversation with a good friend. We talk about views, reflections, friends, incidents, mistakes that we've made, funny anecdotes; it makes for an easier read. My approach is, "This is what I think and feel, you don't have to agree, these are my views. I am not trying to force anyone, but I hope they are persuaded – but it's all right if you disagree." It's a lighter approach, it made the writing easier, but it required more embellishment. The more anecdotes, the better. Anecdotes bring the book to life, rather than a series of arguments. The pictures probably help. It's about reminiscing, history, and geography. At times it's a travelogue, sometimes it's sketching the people you've met. It's a freer format than a memoir or an autobiography.



Q: Would you have anything to say to your readers? What do you hope they take away from your book?

A: It's written at the back of the book, actually. I hope they find resonance, and connect to me too, and know that I've experienced the same things before. If there is chemistry between the writer and the reader, then there will be a relationship, an impact. Many people have read the book, and that has touched me greatly because it shows they've resonated with my writing. Sometimes they say, "I, too, have my family history", or "I have had the same problem before" – that's wonderful. That's sharing, right? As the event neared its end, a long line formed to have Mr. George Yeo sign copies of his books. He interacted with an assortment of fans, both young and old, and kept a firm and friendly smile throughout. Even though Yeo has closed the chapter on his political career, he has embarked on an exciting one as a writer, sharing his various experiences with the rest of the world, time and time again.

The Sunway Alumni Relations team spoke with Chua Yun Zhe, Bachelor of Science (Hons) Financial Analysis alumnus and founder of The Flower Prince, to learn more about the team and business.

How has Sunway University's programme equipped you for employment?

All four of our business partners graduated from Sunway Business School and we would say that the programmes provided us with knowledge and skills that made us all-rounded graduates. Practical application would not be possible without a good foundation of theories. We are well-equipped with inventory management knowledge to perform procurement tasks, finance knowledge to plan budgets, marketing knowledge to spot market opportunities and human resources knowledge in recruiting. Without the programmes we completed, we would never be who we are today.

How did you get started in the world of sustainable flowers?

The main founder gathered the partners one day spontaneously after coming up with the idea to start a business and to dive into the flower bouquet market. Just one call lasting less than an hour on Google Meet marked the beginning of The Flower Prince. We chose to begin with soap flowers because we believed that it was a potential niche market to explore. Indeed, we gained a good customer base for our brand during the Valentine's sales, which was our first-ever marketing campaign. The satisfying sales boosted our confidence to continue expanding the business. We were then eager to reach out to bigger markets to increase our business sustainability. We found that crochet flowers match our initial goals to make long-lasting flower bouquets. When we first launched the crochet flowers, it yielded positive results hence now our focus will be on crochet flowers and designing more bouquets that meet the market needs for different occasions.

How did your programme impact you in your current contribution to society?

There is a specific course that taught us business ethics which promotes high integrity in doing business or working in organisations. This knowledge is extremely important to instil ethical thinking and guide every action taken by us in the workplace. In addition, Sunway's effort in promoting the Sustainable Development Goals on campus and blending it seamlessly into every course develops our conscious actions in finding sustainable ways of doing business that would not harm the environment and society. We prefer green products and embrace gender equality. We are also striving to create more job opportunities for our community through our business.



How are your roles in the business segregated?

It is worth mentioning that the partners studied different programmes, including Financial Analysis, Business Management and International Business, all of which equipped us with the essential skills and knowledge to operate our company smoothly. We are mainly separated into two departments. The roles are segregated clearly as each of us have our own specialties. We never have trouble specifying the roles of each partner as it so happens that each of us could contribute evenly and fill in the gaps in the team.

How do you and your team balance between work and friendship?

Some of us may have had moments when we dream of working with friends. The Flower Prince has definitely made this come true for the four of us. As partners, we know our job scope and carry out our parts without procrastination and questioning. As friends, we are easily contactable every day at any second to discuss an idea or share a thought. I cannot recall how many random calls we started at night just to identify the cause of a problem and come up with possible solutions. I believe this is the advantage that our friendship has brought to the business.

How do you incorporate eco-friendly practices into your business?

The crochet flower itself is an eco-friendly product because it is a permanent flower that you can keep as a commemorative decoration at home and in the office. From the start of preparing a crochet flower bouquet to the end stage of delivering it to the customer, you will hardly find plastic waste, harmful chemicals and non-biodegradable materials. We also try to reduce unnecessary wrapping in preparing the parcel like bubble wrap. The knowledge on sustainability learned in the University is deeply embedded in us and forms our belief that the basis of a sustainable business are environmental-friendly practices put in place.

How do you come up with new designs for your crochet flowers?

I would like to thank my partners in the Product and Operation team Chew Chun Liang, Jenny Tan Joo Yi, Yeoh Pei Wen who are also Sunway Business School alumni, for always keeping themselves updated with the latest market trends. We would normally generate new designs based on marketing plans for special celebratory occasions or seasons like graduation. The other source of inspiration comes from our customers when we offer customisation options for them. Currently, we are very much concentrating on seasonal graduation products. Valentine's Day this year marks the first anniversary of our brand, and we are very excited about it. In the long term, we will diversify into more product variety including decorative products like frames, door gifts, baskets or flower bottles.

Harmful effects of e-Waste

- Toxic materials could leak into the environment
- It can cause health issues within the community
- Discarded e-Waste are transported to landfill sites
- Non-biodegradable toxic components will accumulate

How is e-Waste processed?

This is the primary step in e-Waste recovery. Typical components process includes segregation, dismantling, destruction, crushing, shredding, magnetic separations and decontamination.

The chemical treatment plant handles chemically contaminated waste and coated metals and is function purpose built to provide a full range of precious metal recovery and refining process.

The plant has continuous monitoring with an auto shut-off system to ensure that the highest environmental management standards are observed in accordance with the local environmental discharge regulations.

An advanced scrubber system is adopted to provide excellent air pollution control and remove toxic fumes from the exhaust airstream before discharging it into the atmosphere.

Computer-controlled ICP analysing equipment is used to identify metallic and hazardous wastes and determine the optimum processing treatment with sampling and weighting carried out under stringent controlled conditions.

Thaipusam's Honouring of Lord Murugan

As the biggest festival for Hindus after Deepavali, Thaipusam draws millions of devotees worldwide to honour Lord Murugan, the Hindu god of war.

The word "Thaipusam" is a combination of "Thai," denoting the month in the Tamil calendar when the festival occurs, and "Pusam," signifying a constellation of three stars. Traditionally observed in January or February, in accordance with the Tamil Almanac calendar, this year's Thaipusam falls on January 25, 2024.

Significance

For Hindus, Thaipusam is a day dedicated to purifying oneself from sins and seeking repentance for any transgressions in the preceding year. The festival commemorates the triumph of the Hindu God Murugan over the demon Soorapadman. Thus, Thaipusam symbolises the vanquishing of malevolent forces, marking the victory of virtue over vice.

The tale of Lord Murugan

Murugan, the God of war, is regarded as the patron deity of Tamil Nadu for his courage, valour, and divine grace. The story of Lord Murugan holds profound roots in Hindu mythology and varies across different texts and traditions. However, a pivotal tale that connects him to Thaipusam involves Goddess

Parvati gifting the 'Vel' to Muruga, empowering him to vanquish a formidable demon.

When Murugan was appointed as the champion of the Devas, his mother Parvati bestowed upon him the vel, a sacred spear crafted from five metals — silver, gold, lead, copper, and iron.

Murugan used the spear in battles against the Asuras, led by the formidable Soorapadman. Engaged in a fierce duel, Soorapadman transformed into a colossal mango tree in an attempt to overpower Murugan and the Devas, who had gained substantial ground.

This did not waver Murugan, and he courageously hurled his 'Vel,' slashing the tree into two halves, which then transformed into a peacock and a cockerel, thereby defeating Soorapadman and his forces. Murugan chose the peacock as his divine vehicle and embraced the rooster as his sacred banner.

This is why, on Thaipusam, devotees would pierce metal or iron rods through their cheeks resembling the vel or carry a kavadi (burden), an intricately adorned wooden or steel structure embellished with peacock feathers and other symbols associated with Murugan.

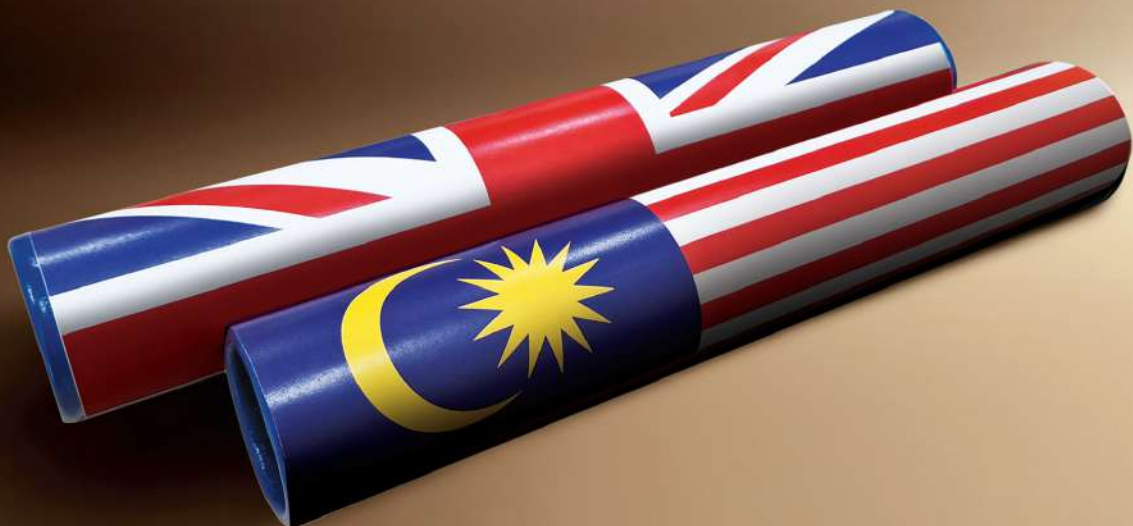
