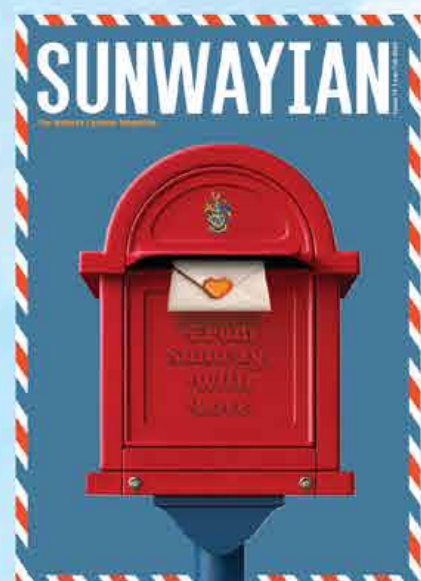

Building on last year's momentum, this year's theme "Together for Tomorrow: Excellence, Engagement, Evolution - Celebrating Leadership and Ranking Excellence" reflected a shared commitment to advance academic excellence, strengthen engagement, and champion transformative evolution within the global education ecosystem.

This year also saw the launch of the Academic Road Trip (ART), a bold initiative that brings academics and students together through collaborative learning and journeys. Participants were engaged through inspiring keynotes, expert panels, and hands-on workshops featuring leading voices in educational innovation, rankings, employability, and future-ready skills.

A key highlight of the event was the official launch of the ALL ASIA Public & Private University Rankings 2026, which recognises 493 public and private institutions in Asia. The ranking evaluates institutions rigorously across six dimensions: Community Engagement, Employability, Student Satisfaction, Research Excellence, Internationalisation and Peer Recognition, placing student feedback and employability outcomes at the core of its methodology.

Responding to the growing demand for a more meaningful, student-centric evaluation of higher education in Asia, this new ranking marks a shift towards greater impact and real-world relevance. As the results were unveiled, Sunway University once again emerged as the top Malaysian private university in Asia, ranking sixth, and reaffirming its position as a rising institution of impact and innovation.

Professor Sibrandes Poppema, President and Vice Chancellor of Sunway University, shared, "The AppliedHE ALL ASIA rankings highlight the depth and diversity of excellence across Asian universities. For Sunway University, being recognised among the region's leading institutions affirms our purpose as a mission-driven 5th generation university, committed to empowering impactful research, building meaningful partnerships, and developing talent for the world. Hosting the AppliedHE Xchange reflects our shared commitment and underscores the importance of institutions coming together to advance a better tomorrow for future generations."

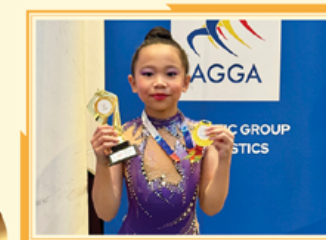
International Gold Triumph for SIS Iskandar Puteri

Did you know Sunway University was named one of the Top 150 Young Universities in the World by QS?

Imagine a place so ambitious it tried to gather all human knowledge. Every scroll, every manuscript, every fragment of thought from the known world, all collected under one roof. That was the Library of Alexandria, a centre of scholarship and curiosity like no other.

Founded in the 3rd century BCE under the Ptolemies in Egypt, the Library was more than a building; it was a mission. Ships docking in Alexandria were reportedly searched for manuscripts to copy, ensuring the Library absorbed ideas from across the Mediterranean. Greeks, Romans, Egyptians, and scholars from elsewhere all converged here, creating a rare hub of intellectual and cultural exchange.

Separating fact from legend is tricky. The Library probably housed thousands of scrolls, but claims that it contained all human knowledge are likely exaggerated. Some myths suggest it held works lost to history — treatises predating known civilisations, secret inventions, or forgotten philosophies. Plausible? Perhaps. Certain? Almost certainly not.

Its destruction is equally mysterious. Fires, wars, and neglect erased much of the collection, possibly more than once. What vanished is unknowable: scientific ideas, literary works, philosophical debates. Did it contain knowledge we no longer have? Possibly, but we can never know for sure. And maybe that is exactly why the Library has captured the imagination of so many. A mix of ambition, loss, and mystery that feels timeless.

But here is the thing: the Library of Alexandria was not just about physical books. It was about the audacity to imagine a world where knowledge could be gathered, shared, and built upon. It was about human curiosity, obsession, and ambition. And in that sense, it is not entirely lost. Every time we read, research, or debate, we carry forward a tiny spark of that same spirit. Every library, bookshelf, and online archive is a tribute to that "lost and unfound" ambition.

And let us not forget the mystery. Some of its legend is probably exaggerated. It might never have contained everything. There are no blueprints, no final inventory. Fires, multiple destructions, and rebuildings over centuries mean we will never know exactly what it was like. Maybe that is the point: the Library exists as story, dream, and cautionary tale rolled into one. It reminds us that the pursuit of knowledge is as important as the knowledge itself, and that even when things are lost, ideas have a stubborn way of surviving.

So the next time you wander through a library or scroll endlessly online, imagine yourself in Alexandria. Imagine the scholars, the stacks of scrolls, the tiny victories of copying a rare text, the frustration of losing one. And smile a little: humanity has always been obsessed with learning, with understanding, and with building something bigger than itself. The Library of Alexandria may be lost... but its spirit? That is unfound in the best possible way, waiting for us to keep chasing it.

EMBRACING THE AI FUTURE

YB Gobind Singh Deo Minister of Digital

Recently, I spoke at a conference on a question that is increasingly urgent: "AI: To Adopt or to Adapt?". The answer, I believe, is not a choice. We must do both, and we must do them well. Because adoption and adaptation are not competing choices, they are two wings of the same bird. One drives innovation, the other secures trust, and together, they are uplifting Malaysia's digital future.

Not long ago, Artificial Intelligence (AI) was a concept for the future. Today, its use is becoming widespread. In Malaysia, we are already seeing its transformative power. Roughly 27 percent of enterprises in Malaysia have adopted AI, although most applications are still at an early stage of implementation.

AI adoption is already delivering progress across critical sectors. In healthcare, AI is helping doctors detect diseases earlier and improve patient outcomes. In agriculture, it is guiding precision farming and optimising yields. Even within the standards and quality ecosystem, AI adoption is quietly reshaping practice by automating inspection and certification, improving consistency in testing and identifying defects that the human eye might miss.

The public sector is seeing gains as well. The Ministry of Digital ran a pilot with 270 officers last year to test how AI could improve daily work. Today, that pilot has grown into a nationwide rollout reaching 445,000 officers.

We must also recognise that AI is not just transforming surface-level applications. It is also reshaping the very foundations of how our economies function, how decisions are made and how trust is built in a digital society.

The promise of AI is accompanied by a new class

of risks. There are questions about data integrity, algorithmic bias, accountability and the transparency of decisions made by machines. As AI becomes more deeply embedded, we must ask how we ensure that what is efficient also remains ethical? How do we balance automation with human oversight, innovation with inclusion and speed with safety? And how do we preserve trust, not only in the technologies we build, but in the institutions that govern them?

Malaysia is adapting with foresight and wisdom through three important ways. We are focusing on infrastructure, digital trust and talent.



Let me break this down for you.

On infrastructure, we are strengthening the foundations that make AI innovation possible. This means the data, connectivity and compute capabilities that form the bedrock of our digital economy. This is about ensuring our technology stack is future-ready and meets the needs of our homegrown innovators.

On digital trust, AI can only create value when people have confidence that it is used safely and ethically. We are reinforcing governance frameworks through the Cyber Security Act 2024 and safeguarding personal data through the Personal Data Protection Act 2010. We have also developed the National AI Action Plan (2026-2030) to guide our journey toward becoming an AI Nation by 2030. This is complemented by a Digital Trust and Data Security Strategy (2026-2030), ensuring our progress in AI is matched by the strength of our governance and integrity of our digital ecosystem.

And finally, on talent. In an era where AI is reshaping the very nature of work, adaptation is not an option, but it is a necessity. To prepare for any potential impact, the government has established the MyMahir National AI Council for Industry to coordinate AI talent development, adoption strategies and cross-sectoral collaboration. These efforts are complemented by strategic collaborations with global technology partners aimed at upskilling and reskilling Malaysians in AI fluency and skills.

When we ask, "To adopt or to adapt?", the answer is both in balance. Adoption drives progress. Adaptation secures trust. Both are needed for a flourishing AI ecosystem that serves the greater good of all.

To the students of Sunway who are passionate about technology and innovation, your generation, holds the key to guiding this evolution. I urge you to study, to question, to innovate and to be the responsible stewards of the technologies you build.

The road was not always smooth but filled with perseverance and remarkable growth. It has been a blessing to be surrounded by such incredible people, and I am sincerely grateful for all the support I have received from everyone.

A: Exploring the world of education from multiple perspectives has been incredibly helpful, whether through spearheading my community project to make debate education more accessible, collaborating with education providers, or keeping up with recent developments in the field.

What were your preparation steps before heading off to Cambridge/Oxford?

JM: Preparing for Oxford involves both academic and personal aspects. Strengthening my foundation in physics and mathematics during my break before university has helped ensure a smoother transition into my studies. Preparing for independent living overseas will be a challenge, but I believe it will train me to adapt to unfamiliar situations and ultimately build greater confidence.

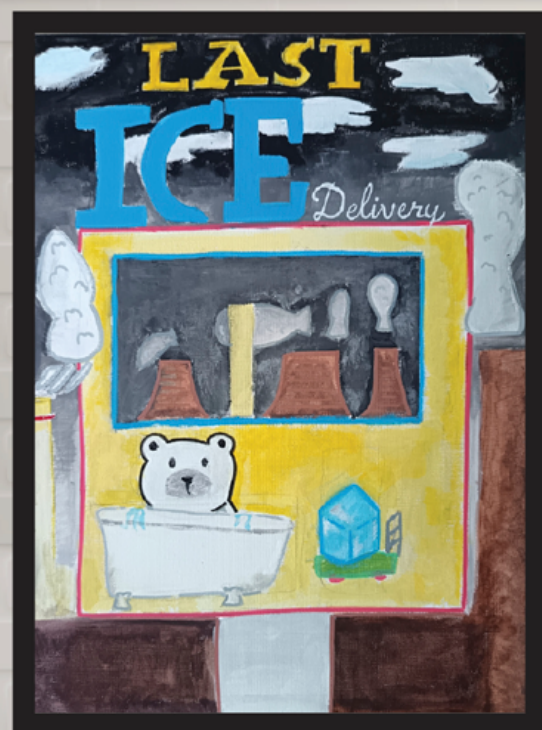

Chinese New Year and the Luck of Ang Pao

Chinese New Year is approaching, and one of the most iconic traditions is the giving of red envelopes, or *ang pao*. These bright little packets are more than just money. They are filled with symbolism, blessings, and a touch of luck. Let's take a closer look at some fun facts you might not know about them.

Red is Luck

The colour red is everywhere during Chinese New Year and for a good reason. Red envelopes are not just festive; they are believed to ward off evil spirits and bring good fortune. Every time you hand one over, you are not just giving money, but also a bundle of blessings wrapped in crimson luck.

Different Names Same Tradition

Depending on where you are in the world, you might hear different names. In Malaysia, it is *ang pao* (红包), in Mandarin it is *hóng bāo* (红包), and in Cantonese, it is *lai see* (利是). No matter what you call it, the tradition is the same: a little red packet that carries wishes of happiness, wealth, and luck for the year ahead.

Even Numbers are Lucky

Most red envelopes contain even numbers of notes because even numbers are considered auspicious and are associated with the saying, "good things come in pairs". But watch out for the number four. It is avoided because it sounds like death in Chinese (四 "sì" sounds like 死 "sǐ"). So next time you prepare your *ang pao* stash for friends or classmates, check the count carefully.

New Notes

Not all cash is created equal when it comes to *ang pao*. Traditionally, new, crisp bills are used because wrinkled or torn notes are considered unlucky. Giving fresh notes is thought to bring more luck and prosperity to the recipient, making the gesture even more meaningful and auspicious.

Digital Ang Pao as the New Trend

Technology has given a modern twist to this ancient tradition. Digital red envelopes are now popular on apps and e-wallets, allowing you to send luck to your family and friends anytime and anywhere. It is like sharing fortune at the speed of Wi-Fi, and yes, the luck is very real.

Words of Blessing

Most envelopes are more than just red paper; they are printed with phrases like *Gōng xī fā cái* (恭喜发财, Wishing you wealth) or *Xīn nián kuài lè* (新年快乐, Happy New Year). These little blessings are just as important as the money inside, reminding us that Chinese New Year is all about blessings and joy.

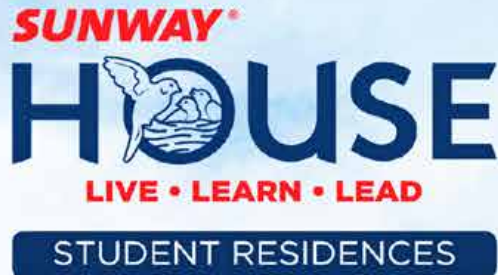
